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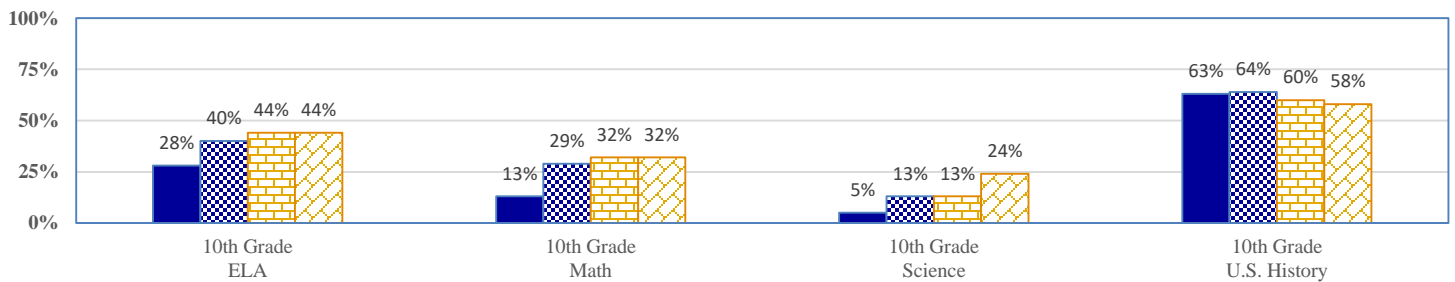
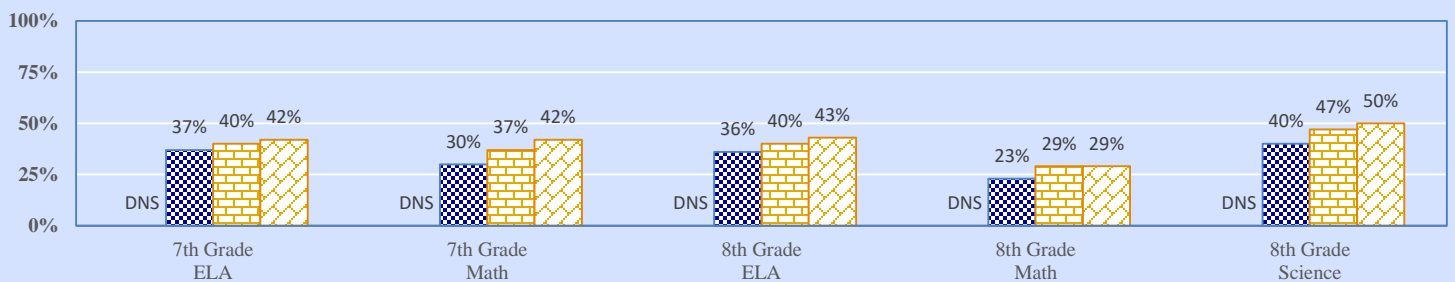
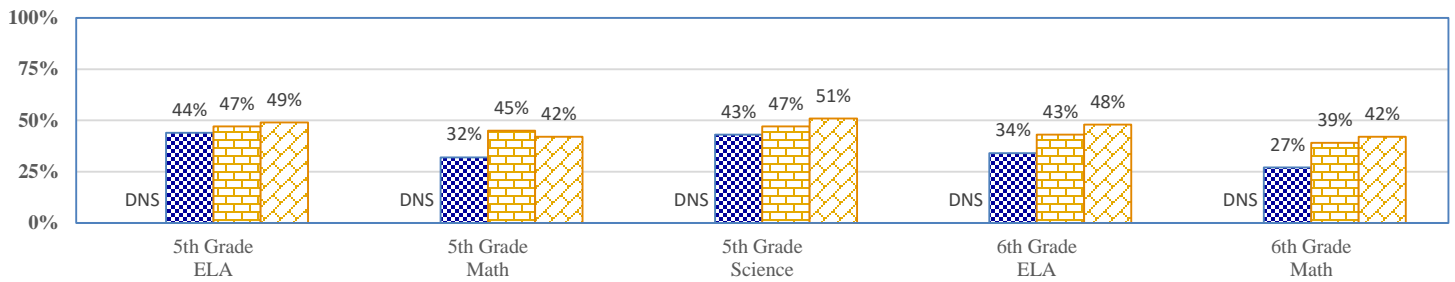
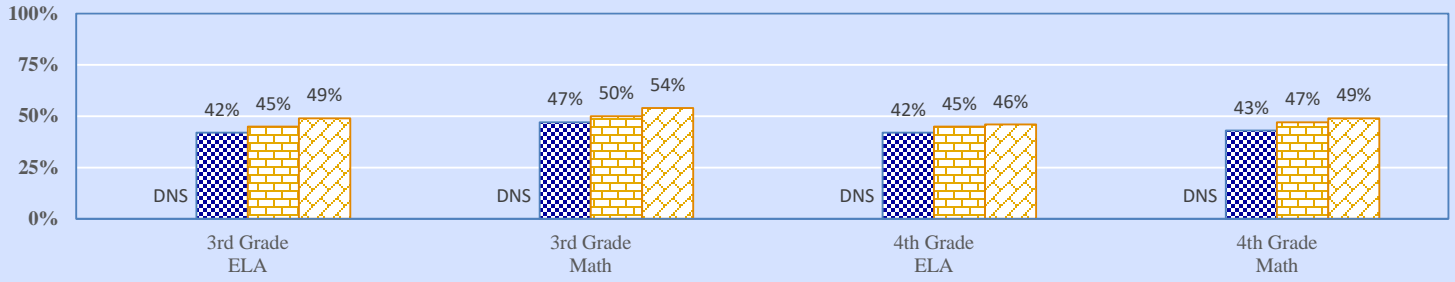
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2016-17 Student Performance (Regular Education Students, Full Academic Year at This Site)

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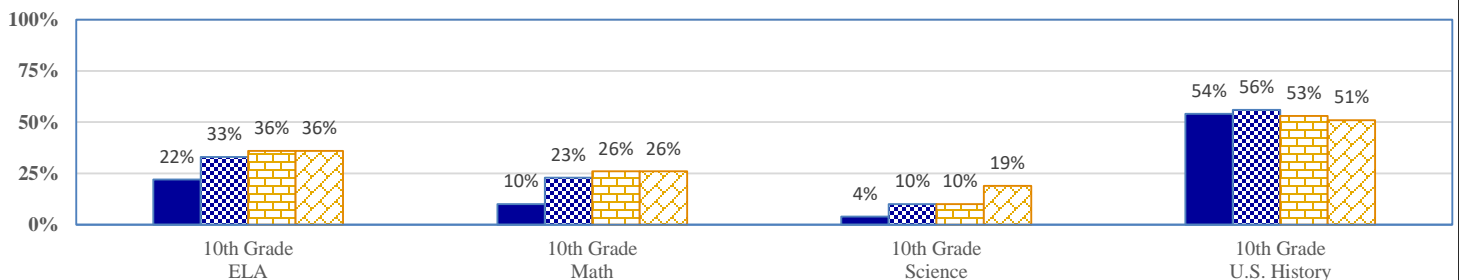
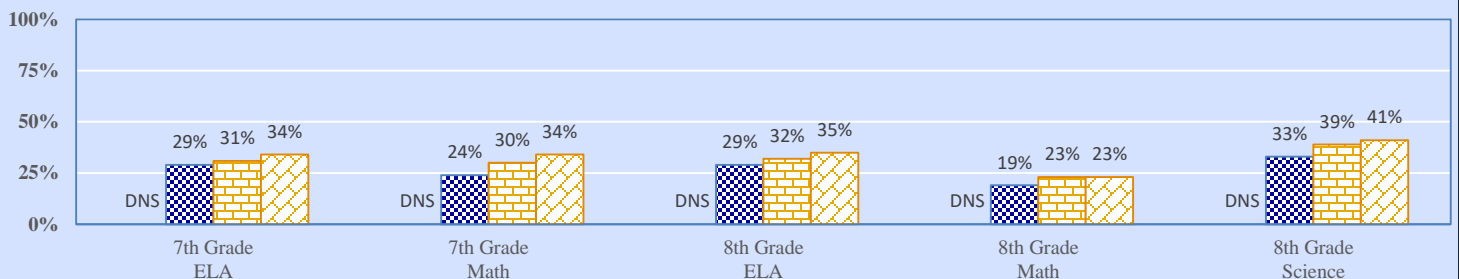
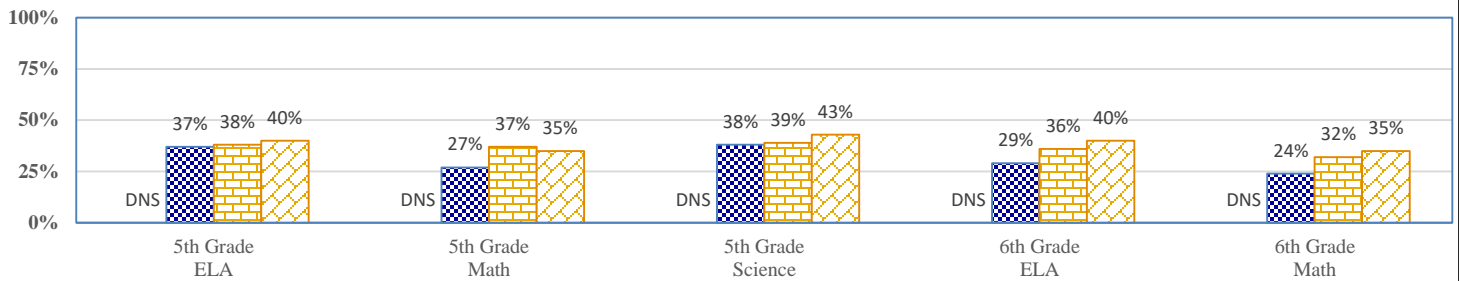
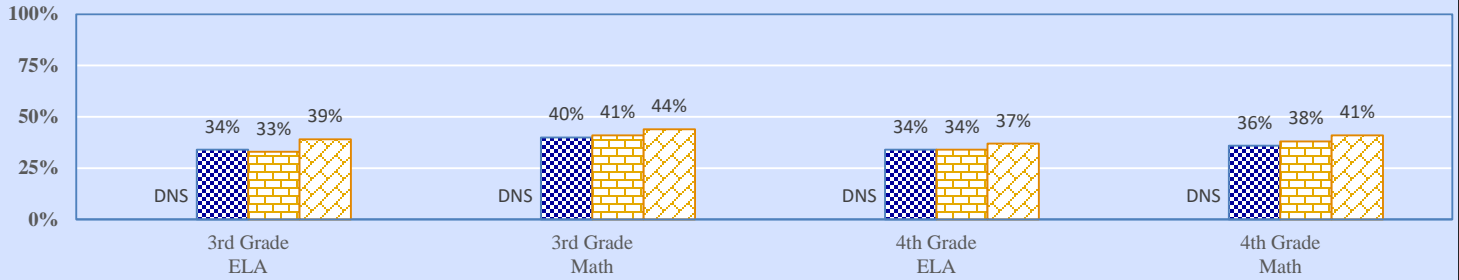
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2016-17 Student Performance (All Students)
