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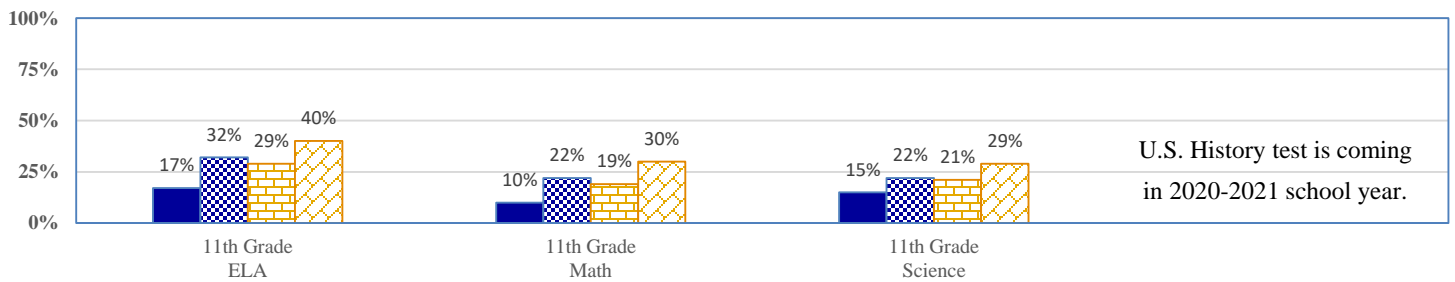

**% of Students Scoring Proficient and Above by Grade and Subject**

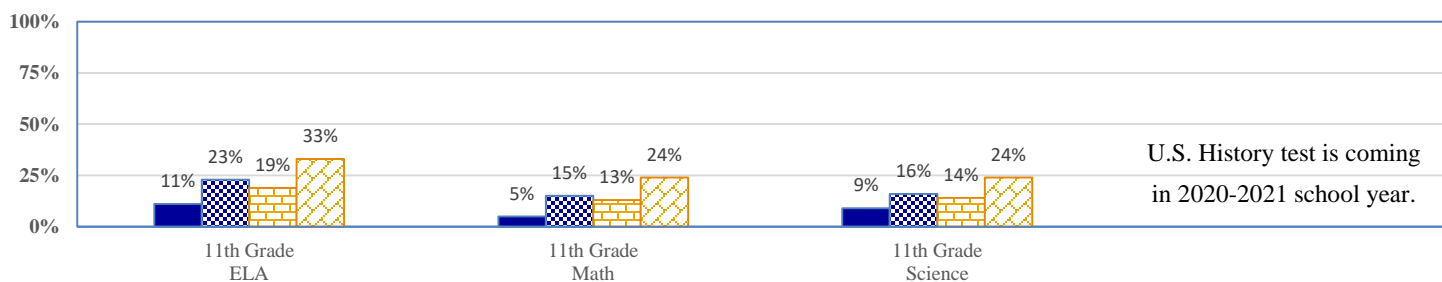
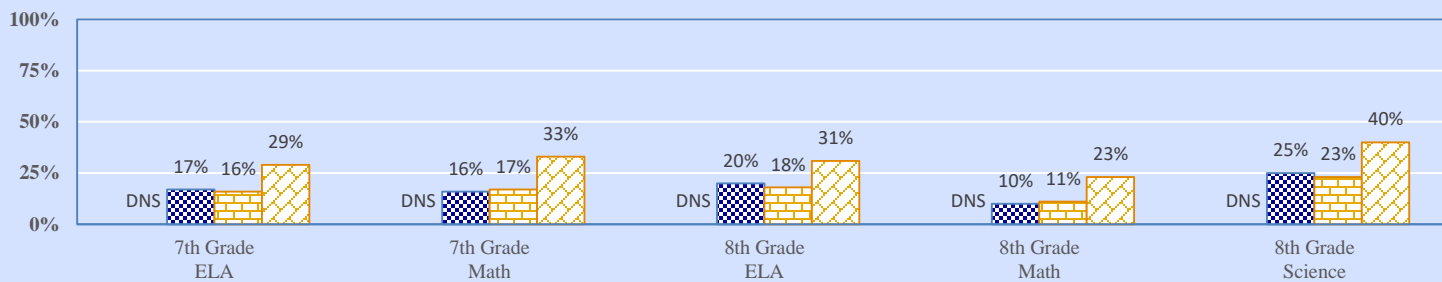
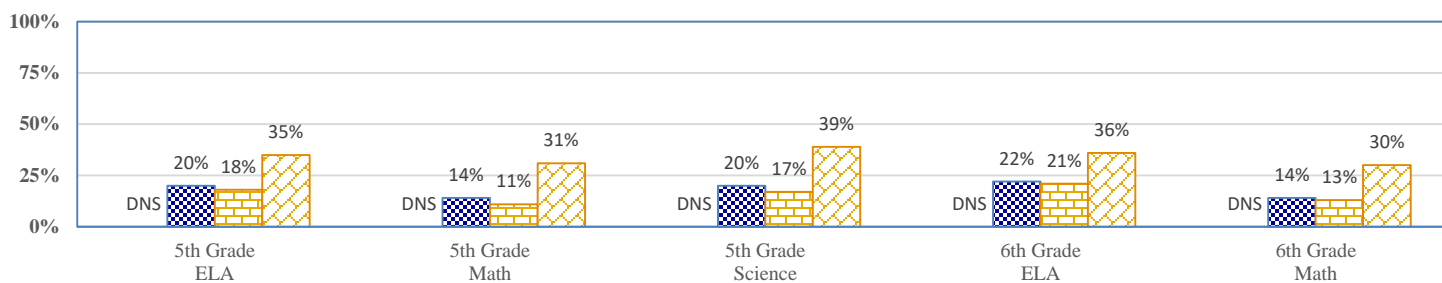
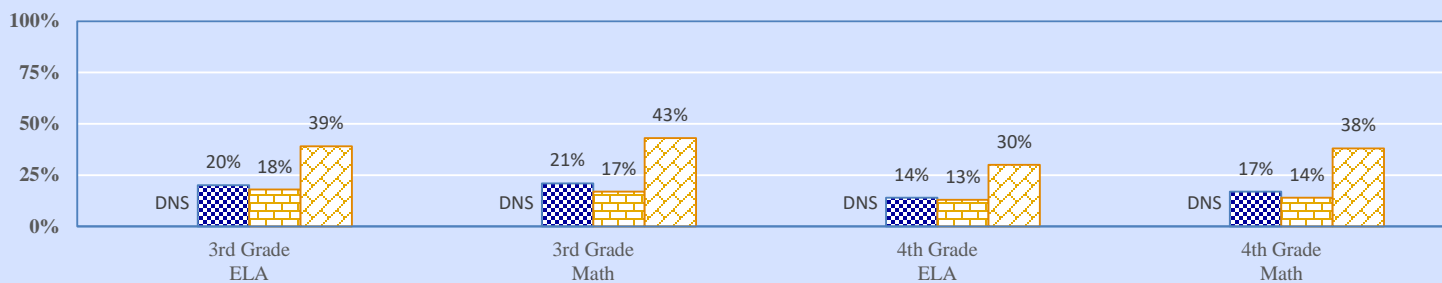
